



SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The Roanoke Regional Home Builders Association, Inc. (RRHBA) is a professional, non-profit trade organization. Our mission statement is to “serve, support & represent the building industry.”

The intent and goal of the RRHBA – by offering a one-time \$500.00 scholarship – is to assist promising young people who are interested in pursuing a career in the construction industry. It is the belief of RRHBA that the Construction Industry is advanced by education in the curriculums of construction, civil engineering, surveying, architecture and real estate.

To be considered for the RRHBA scholarships, an individual must meet the following requirements:

To Apply:

- Be a graduating senior from a local high school.
- Be seeking to attend a college, university, or school of higher learning; preference will be given for an in-state school

Deadline: Have a completed application on file **in the office of the Roanoke Regional Home Builders Association, Inc. no later than Friday, April 8, 2016.**

For Award:

- Demonstrate scholastic and community achievement.
- Establish need.
- Have completed the appropriate application forms.
- Be accepted at an in-state college, university, or school of higher learning with the intent of enrolling in one of the following areas of curriculum:
 1. Construction
 2. Civil Engineering
 3. Surveying
 4. Architecture
 5. Engineering (technology, others)
 6. Real Estate (marketing)
 7. Others (business, etc.)

For Receipt:

- Be officially enrolled in selected college, university, or school of higher learning.
- Notification by appropriate school official must be made to the Roanoke Regional Home Builders Association, Inc. that enrollment is in effect.
- Scholarship will be financially awarded as a credit against the recipient’s balance through the respective school’s Treasurer’s office.
- Recognition of recipients is made, if attendance is possible, during an appropriate meeting of the RRHBA Board of Directors or general membership meeting.
